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The cancer of unknown primary (CUP) multidisciplinary team

A patient's guide



What is a multidisciplinary team?

A multidisciplinary team (MDT) is a group of doctors and other health professionals with expertise in a specific cancer, who together discuss and manage an individual patient's care.

They plan the treatment that is best for you.

Who is in the team?

The team consists of:

- radiologists (specialists in x-rays and related scans)
- a histopathologist (doctor who makes diagnosis from tissue samples)
- an oncologist (doctor specialised in chemotherapy and radiotherapy)
- a clinical nurse specialist
- an MDT coordinator

How does an MDT work?

When an MDT meets, they consider all of the scan and test results that you have had since your initial cancer diagnosis.

This helps them to plan the treatment that is most effective for you, taking into account your age, general health, the cancer stage (its size and whether it has spread) and its grade (which indicates how quickly it may grow or develop).

They also ensure your psychological and social needs are considered and your care is coordinated in an efficient and timely manner.

What does cancer of unknown primary (CUP) mean?

It means that the cancer we have detected in your body has not started in the place where it has been found but it is a secondary stage.

This means the team will aim to offer treatments which will help with the symptoms of your disease.

It may not be necessary for the team to perform further investigations to find the original site of the cancer.

Information from tests that are already performed will be able to provide you with effective treatment and care.
