Specialist children's services

We aim to offer a seamless service to children, young people and families. In doing so we work closely with other professionals working with your child e.g. social care and education and where appropriate we offer team around the child meetings.

Where required we share information with other professionals on a need to know basis in order to best meet the needs of your child. If you do not wish for us to do this please inform the department.



Medical Appointments

Where there are ongoing medical problems we provide follow-up for children and young people to plan management and interventions. If required we will discuss with you whether you would like to be referred on to other specialists for further support.

We also contribute medical information for an Education Health Care Plan.

Why are you being sent an appointment?

If this is your first contact with us, we will have received a referral from one of the professionals known to your child or young person who should have discussed this with you and obtained your consent. We accept referrals from a wide range of professionals working with children which includes, GPs, health visitors, school health advisers, SENCOs, dieticians, education and nursery staff.

What does the service do?

The community paediatric service is part of the child development team. The service is for children and young people up to 18 years old or up to 19 years old, if still attending school, who have developmental problems or disabilities and associated health problems.



Specialist paediatricians undertake assessments, investigations, diagnosis and management of children and young people with a range of developmental difficulties and disabilities. We work as part of the child development team with other professionals including Physios, OTs, dieticians and Speech and language therapists.

Children are seen for a variety of different assessments for example: cerebral palsy, autism, Down syndrome.
