Governance Review Trust Board update October 2014.

In April the Executive team instigated a 3 month 'Task and finish' internal governance and risk review with a clear terms of reference to:-

- update the Committee structure for the organisation
- update the organisational structure
- complete work on risk assessment across the organisation
- develop handbooks for the Trust Committees.

Methodology

A small working group was convened chaired by the Deputy Chief Executive. Best practice examples of committee structures were obtained from other organisations. The latest guidance from Monitor and the TDA were reviewed. The Committee structure as of April was reviewed against these at an internal desktop review with the Medical Director and Director of Nursing. The recommendations of this review were presented to the Executive Team and also discussed at a Trust Board seminar in July.

The Committee structure in April 2014 consisted of 57 Committees and groups below the level of the Trust Board and Board Committees. The July 2014 version has reduced the number of groups to 36.

The Committee structure proposed is seen in the tables below Table 1 – Trust Board and committee structure

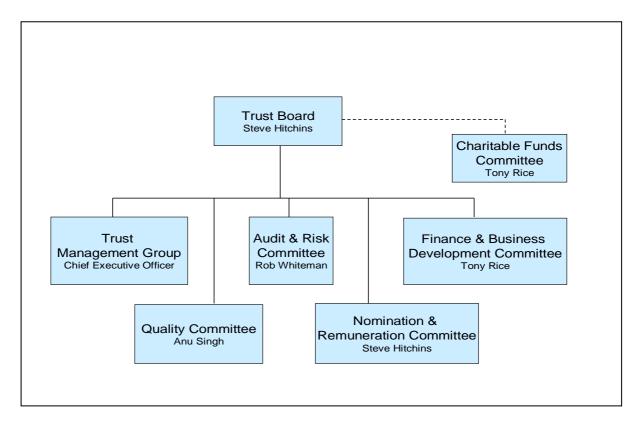
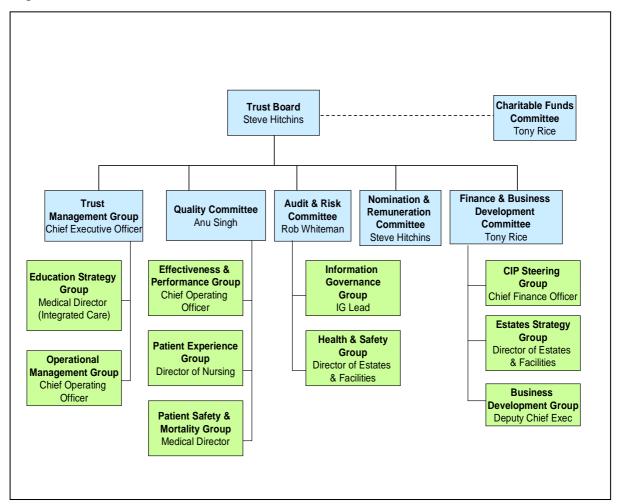


Table 2 Trust Board, committee structure and next level down in the organisation
